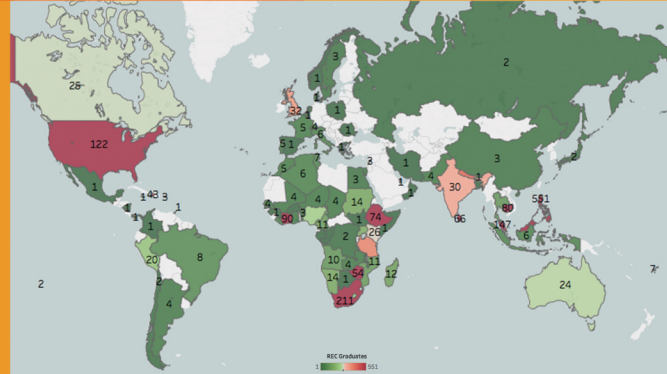

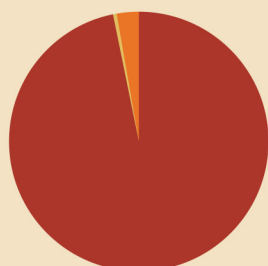

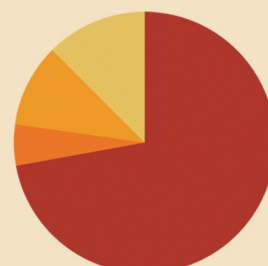
## ACCOUNTS
