



## Important considerations

- Carefully consider the stage for each question
  The stage influences your possible responses
  Lower stages 0-1 require more general responses
  Higher stages are more specific and detailed
  - Example: "Dog vaccines are available in at least one location in the country" – Stage 1
    - Thus, if a some vaccine is available at one place in the country, this is answered 'Yes'
